Letter from Peter Tiboris

Dear touring members:

We are pleased to have you join our MIDAM 2017 Vienna music tour. Here are some important things to remember about your upcoming trip with us:

1. It is critical and essential that all of your music be thoroughly prepared upon arrival. Please bring a black folder to cradle your music and have a pencil available to mark your score during rehearsals.
2. English is spoken everywhere; although learning a few greetings in German is always welcome by those in Austria... and fun.
3. Concert attire:
For men: black suit jacket and black pants, white shirt and black tie, black shoes;
For women: Black top and bottom, short or long sleeves, comfortable black shoes (any type);
For conductors: black dinner jacket, white shirt and black bow-tie OR white-tie and tails.
For everyone: do NOT wear jewelry and please, no cologne for the dress rehearsals or concerts.
4. You are in the center of large and important city so everything is available to buy with credit cards and euros. Regarding euros, we would recommend bringing some from the U.S. prior to arriving in Vienna, just for convenience. You can convert dollars to euros everywhere and anywhere with your passport at any bank in Europe.
5. There is going to be walking to some rehearsals, concerts and general tours -- buses are sometimes restricted from central areas of Vienna. Be sure to bring comfortable walking shoes and a hat for the sun; Light, comfortable clothes are the best.
6. There will be some evenings where you are having an "evening out", so casual/smart attire is necessary. Gentlemen should bring a sports jacket for some evenings....Vienna is more "formal" than the U.S.A, in general.
7. Porterage service for your luggage is not part of the package. You must be responsible to take your own luggage to your room and also to the lobby upon departure. Be sure that all of your luggage has your name broadly on it, the luggage tag should have your name AND the following: American Choral Tour – MIDAM International. Please put your residency hotels on the tag as well.
8. You may be asked to provide a credit card upon arrival at the hotel front desk for any "extras" you charge such as from the mini-bar or food and drink for lunch and dinner if you choose to eat at the hotel. Please make sure you pay the "extras" when you check out.

We look forward to seeing you all in Vienna.

GENERAL MUSIC DIRECTOR

MIDAM INTERNATIONAL:



Peter Tiboris, Greek American conductor, music director, and producer, has enjoyed a worldwide career for more than forty years of which the past thirty have been in New York City. He is the founder and music director of MidAmerica Productions, which has produced concerts in Carnegie Hall, Weill Recital Hall at Carnegie Hall, David Geffen Hall, and Alice Tully Hall in New York; the Festival of the Aegean in Syros, Greece; performance series in Vienna, Austria, and Florence, Italy; and concerts throughout Europe and the U.S. Maestro Tiboris is also the founder of the Manhattan Philharmonic, Elysium Recordings, and MidAm International.

Since 1983, he has presented 1300 concerts worldwide and 1000 in New York, including 550 on the main stage of Carnegie Hall, where he has also conducted numerous concerts. He is Music Director and Conductor of the Manhattan Philharmonic and the Pan-European Philharmonia, in Warsaw, Poland. He is Principal Guest Conductor of Orchestra da Camera Fiorentina, in Florence, Italy; and General Music Director and Conductor of Symphonisches Orchestra Wien, in

Vienna, Austria, the orchestra which is appearing on June 20 and 21.

Maestro Tiboris made his European conducting debut on July 1, 1983, in Dubrovnik, Yugoslavia, with the Moscow Philharmonia as part of the Dubrovnik Festival; and his New York conducting debut on January 7, 1984, with the American Symphony Orchestra at Lincoln Center. Since then, he has conducted in 20 countries and led the world's most renowned symphony orchestras. In 2016, he made his Asian conducting debut with the Macao Symphony Orchestra in China.

On his Carnegie Hall series, Peter Tiboris has showcased hundreds of guest conductors and thousands of visiting ensembles, and he has presented numerous and significant world and American premieres, many of which he has conducted. He performs on ten of thirty CDs released by Elysium Recordings. The International Festival of the Aegean will present its 13th season in Syros this coming July, and MidAm International is presenting performances in Vienna, Florence, and Syros also in 2017.

Peter Tiboris studied music at the University of Wisconsin and received a doctorate from the University of Illinois, but he credits his move to New York City some thirty years ago as the most important event in his musical and professional life. He is married to the soprano Eilana Lappalainen, and they reside in Germany, Greece, and the U.S.

Matthew Harden is founder and artistic director of the adult chamber ensemble Madrigali et al., which is the fourth choral ensemble he has built over his career. In addition, he is Music Minister at St. Cecilia Roman Catholic Church in Kearny, New Jersey. His collegiate teaching experience includes being Director of Choral Activities at three different universities, The University of Nebraska at Omaha, The University of South Dakota and East Carolina University. Dr. Harden earned his doctoral degree in Interdisciplinary Studies (Choral Music Education) from the Conservatory of Music at the University of Missouri-Kansas City, his master's degree from Portland State University, and two bachelor's degrees (Performance and Education) from Southern Oregon State College. His studies and degrees are in the areas

of conducting, organ performance, music education, and vocal performance. He has taught private voice lessons since 1983 and worked with several singers to rehabilitate their injured voices. He founded the North Coast Chorale, now celebrating its twenty-eighth year. He was assistant conductor and tenor section leader for the Portland Symphonic Choir, Artistic Director for the Early Music ensemble "Sine Nomine," and taught in various Oregon schools for twelve years. He has conducted choirs on tour in the United States, Belgium, Denmark, Estonia, Germany, Greece, Mexico, Norway, Spain, Russia and The Netherlands, and festival choirs in Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Carolina, North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota and most recently the professional choir Polifonia in Lithuania. An active member of the ACDA, Chorus America, NAFME, NCCO, and IFCM, he served as President of the Nebraska Choral Directors' Association from 2011-2013.

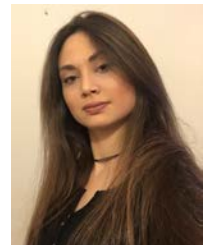

Kathryn Wieckhorst is an American soprano currently living in Hamburg, Germany. In May, 2016, she returned to Carnegie Hall as a soloist in John Rutter's Requiem, having made her solo debut there in 2013 as the soprano soloist in Vivaldi's Gloria. In the Spring of 2016, she premiered the role of Winifred in Friedelind's Wahnfried, in its world premiere at Wahnfried in Bayreuth, Germany. Most recently on the operatic stage, Kathryn made her role debut as Konstanze in Die Entführung aus dem Serail with the Opera Theater of Montclair in New Jersey. She has also worked with them in outreach performances of Die Zauberflöte as the Königin der Nacht. Other roles Kathryn has sung are: Violetta in La Traviata with the Long Island Opera Company and the Bronx Opera Company, the title role in Suor Angelica with the Festival of the Aegean and at Queens College, the Lady with the Tattoos in Ich bin der Welt abhanden gekommen

with the Bel Cantanti Opera Company, the Countess in Le Nozze di Figaro, Musetta in La Bohème, Micaela in Carmen, and Blanche in Dialogues of the Carmelites. In July 2013, she made her international debut as Fiordiligi in Mozart's Così fan tutte in the Festival of the Aegean in Syros, Greece. There, she also sang Mme. Goldentrill in Mozart's The Impresario as part of the Greek Opera Studio. In August 2013, Kathryn participated in the Berlin Opera Studio in conjunction with the Festival Junger Künstler Bayreuth, where she sang scenes from Verdi's La Traviata in the Stadhalle in Bayreuth.

2017 MIDAM Vienna Tour Guest Conductors



Thomas Bookhout has prepared and conducted symphony, opera, university, community school, and church choruses for more than three decades. Now in his fifth year with The Phoenix Symphony, he has prepared the Chorus for its varied and challenging repertoire of masterworks, including Verdi's and Mozart's Requiems, Kodaly's Psalmus Hungaricus, Estévez's Cantata Criolla, Pärt's In Principio, Orff's Carmina Burana, Bernstein's Chichester Psalms, and many others. In 2015, he led The Phoenix Symphony Chorus in its Carnegie Hall debut in the premiere of Dan Forrest's Psalm of Ascension and Haydn's Lord Nelson Mass.

Bookhout also is founder and musical director of the Arizona Sacred Chorale—an independent chorus dedicated to the exceptional performance of fine sacred choral music—and Director of Fine Arts at Scottsdale Christian Academy. Previously, Bookhout was Chorus Master for the West Virginia Symphony, preparing its chorus for major symphonic performances and fully staged operas, which earned positive reviews in the American Record Guide and Opera News. Bookhout also has been Director of Choral Activities at the University of Charleston, Music Director of the Taghkanic Chorale,

Music Pastor and Director at the Camelback Bible Church, and Director of Music at The Stony Brook School.

Dr. Bookhout holds degrees from the Eastman School of Music, Arizona State University, and Houghton College, and serves as a guest conductor and clinician around the United States. He is a member of the Council for the Von Promnitz Palace Center for the Arts in Żary, Poland, and is a member of numerous professional organizations.



John Flanery is the Director of Choral Activities at New Mexico State University. At NMSU he supervises the master's degree in choral conducting, teaches choral literature and choral conducting, and conducts the University Singers, the Statesmen, and the Masterworks Chorus.

Prior to his arrival at NMSU in 2015, John spent nine years as associate choral director at the University of Southern Mississippi. His Doctor of Musical Arts and Master's degrees are in Choral Conducting from the University of Kentucky. He holds a Bachelor's of Music Education degree from Briar Cliff University in Sioux City, Iowa.

John has served ACDA in various positions including as the Mississippi president. For the national ACDA, John has been on the poster selection committee for the conferences in Dallas (2013) and Salt Lake City (2015). He has served as church choir director at churches in Iowa, Kentucky, and Mississippi.

As a high school music educator in the state of Iowa for nine years, John conducted concert choirs, madrigal dinners, show choirs, jazz choirs, and many other ensembles. John is a regular clinician throughout the United States including serving as All-State conductor in Alabama and Kentucky. John and his wife, Juliane, have five children - Elias, Cecelia, Josephine, Lucinda, and William.
